The Final Mission: Foxy's War (Ch4/Plum Pictures) 1 x 60

As a Special Forces soldier Jason Fox endured multiple tours of duty in Afghanistan. Now he returns to learn more about the complex country, the people he was sent to help, and the war's legacy. *Director: Marta Shaw*

The Windsor's Lost Letters (Channel 4/Renegade Pictures) 2 x 60

Expert comment on the British monarchy and democracy in the early twentieth century, with a specific focus on the young Windsor's siblings and their relationships told through their personal correspondence.
